Analogy or Similarity

Analogy means similarity or bearing a resemblance. In questions based on analogy, you are given a pair of words or letters having certain relationship. From the alternatives provided, you have to select the choice that best matches the relationship existing between the first two words or letters.

The given pair of words or letters is set off by a colon or ratio sign (:) signifying that word X is related to word Y. The double colon (::) that separates the given pair stands for "In the same way".

There are many ways of establishing a relationship. As far as relationship among letters are concerned, facts stated in coding-decoding chapter is applied by at large but word-relationship can be established in following ways, cause and effect, part to whole, synonym, antonym, degree of intensity, type and characteristic, producer and product, worker and tool, class and species etc.

In dealing with analogy questions, the following rules should be observed

- (i) Analyse the relationship between the question pair *i.e.*, before the double colon (::).
- (ii) Look for the pair of words among the answer choices with a similar relationship.
- (iii) If more than one answer choice seems to fit, re-examine the relation in the question pair.
- (iv) Eliminate answers that do not appear to be the related words.
- (v) Parts of speech must be the same in the related words.

Different types of questions asked in the examination are as follows.

TYPE-1 Word Analogy

In this type of questions the candidate is required to identify the relationship between the given pair of words and then find out the similar analogous pair according to the relationship in the given pair. Some of the most common types of analogous relationships are as follows.

Examples

Cause and Effect

In this category an effect is observed due to some cause.

1. 'Goitre' is related to 'Iodine' as 'Anaemia' is related to

(a) Vitamin	(b) Blood
(c) Iron	(d) Weakness
- ⑤ (c) Here, we have cause and effect relationship. 'Goitre' is caused by the deficiency of 'Iodine'. So, if 'Goitre' is related to 'Iodine', then 'Anaemia' will be related to 'Iron' as 'Anaemia' is caused by the deficiency of 'Iron'. Hence, right answer is option (c).

Subset of a Set

On this category a subset is considered to be a small quantity of a bigger set.

2. 'Page' is related to 'Book' as 'Leaf' is related to

(a) Root	(b) Green
(c) Tree	(d) Forest
- ⑤ (c) 'Page' is a part of 'Book' and in the same way, we see that 'Leaf' is a part of 'Tree'. Hence, correct answer is option (c).

Quantity and Unit

In this category standard units of measurements *i.e.*, length, weight, volume, etc, are related.

3. 'Current' is related to 'Ampere' in the same way as 'Weight' is related to

(a) Scale	(b) Pound
(c) Commodity	(d) Measurement
- ⑤ (b) 'Current' is measured in terms of 'Ampere' and 'Weight' is measured in terms of 'Pound'. Hence, correct answer is option (b).

Instrument and Measurement

In this category standard instrument related to certain quantity are related.

4. 'Seismograph' is related to 'Earthquakes' in the same way as 'Thermometer' is related to

(a) Fever (b) Doctor
(c) Temperature (d) Mercury

- ⑤ (c) Relationship given in question is the relationship between instrument and the quantity measured by it. 'Seismograph' measures 'Earthquakes' and 'Thermometer' measures 'Temperature'. Hence, correct answer is option (c).

Worker and Tools

In this category standard tools used by specified persons to complete their job are related.

5. 'Doctor' is related to 'Stethoscope' in the same way as 'Painter' is related to

(a) Painting (b) Brush (c) Exhibition (d) Art

- ⑤ (b) 'Stethoscope' is used by a 'Doctor' as a tool to perform his work. Similarly, a 'Painter' uses a 'Brush' as a tool to perform his work. Hence, correct answer is option (b).

Sex Relationship

In this category male and female counter part is related to each other.

6. 'Bull' is related to 'Cow' in the same way as 'Horse' is related to

(a) Animal (b) Mare (c) Stable (d) Meat

- ⑤ (b) This is based on male-female relationship. So, 'Horse' is related to 'Mare'. Hence, correct answer is option (b).

Word and Synonym

In this category words having similar meaning are related or they are called synonyms.

7. 'Dearth' is related to 'Scarcity' in the same way as 'Substitute' is related to

(a) Replace (b) Rumour (c) Destroy (d) Assume

- ⑤ (a) 'Scarcity' is synonym of 'Dearth'. In the same way 'Replace' is a word nearest in meaning to the word 'Substitute'. Therefore, correct answer is option (a).

Word and Antonym

In this category words having opposite meaning are related or they are called antonyms.

8. 'Hate' is related to 'Love' in the same way as 'Create' is related to

(a) Make (b) Renovate (c) Destroy (d) Build

- ⑤ (c) 'Love' is just opposite to 'Hate'. So, the word opposite in meaning to 'Create' is 'Destroy'. Therefore, correct answer is option (c).

Worker and Working Place

In this category, a person work and his work place are related.

9. 'Sailor' is related to 'Ship' in the same way as 'Lawyer' is related to

(a) Legal (b) Law (c) Court (d) Ruling

- ⑤ (c) The place to work of 'Sailor' is 'Ship'. Similarly, the place where 'Lawyer' works is 'Court'. So, correct answer is option (c).

Study and Terminology

In this category study of something and its related standard term of that study are related.

10. 'Numismatic' is related to 'Coin' in the same way as 'Paleontology' is related to

(a) Earth (b) Soil (c) Fossils (d) Stones

- ⑤ (c) Study of 'Coin' is known as 'Numismatic'. 'Paleontology' is the science dealing with study of history of mankind with the help of 'Fossils'. Hence, correct answer is option (c).

Product and Raw Material

In this category raw material and product formed with that raw material are related.

11. 'Shoes' is related to 'Leather' in the same way as 'Rubber' is related to

(a) Plastic (b) Polythene
(c) Latex (d) Chappal

- ⑤ (c) 'Leather' is a raw material used to make 'Shoes'. Similarly, 'Rubber' is made using 'Latex' which is a raw material. Therefore, correct answer is option (c).

Worker and Product

In this category, a person working on an object and the finished product obtained are related.

12. 'Carpenter' is related to 'Furniture' in the same way as 'Blacksmith' is related to

(a) Gold (b) Jewellery (c) Shoes (d) Metal

- ⑤ (d) 'Carpenter' makes 'Furniture'. Similarly, 'Blacksmith' makes 'Metal'. So, correct answer is option (d).

Association Relationship

In this category, the term is related or associated to one another.

In this type of analogy, two groups of letters are related to each other in the same way as given, you are required to find out this relationship and then choose a letter group which is related in the same way from the four options.

- ⊗ (c) The letters in both the groups in a pair are consecutive letters in the order.

Hence, option (c) is correct.

i.e., $2^3 = 8$ and $3^3 = 27$

Hence, option (d) is correct.

(d) 3 : 28

- ⊗ (a) The first number is multiplied by the next prime number to obtain the second number.

i.e., $5 \times 7 = 35$

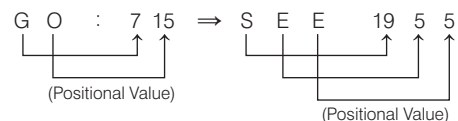
